Animal Control Field Services: Lobby closed until further notice

Animal Control Officers will answer high priority and emergency calls. Those calls include injured or sick stray animals, cruelty and neglect complaints, bite complaints, aggressive animal complaints, and deceased stray animals. **Please call 951 487-6565 for emergency field service.**

Found a stray pet? RHS is also asking people who find friendly stray pets to consider fostering them until the shelter can resume normal operations. Pets typically stay pretty close to home when they go missing, so this helps get pets home much more quickly, without having to endure the stress of the shelter. Stray finders can take the pet to a vet clinic or to RHS to check for a microchip, file a found report, advertise on local lost and found page, and hold the pet to give the owner time to locate it.
