

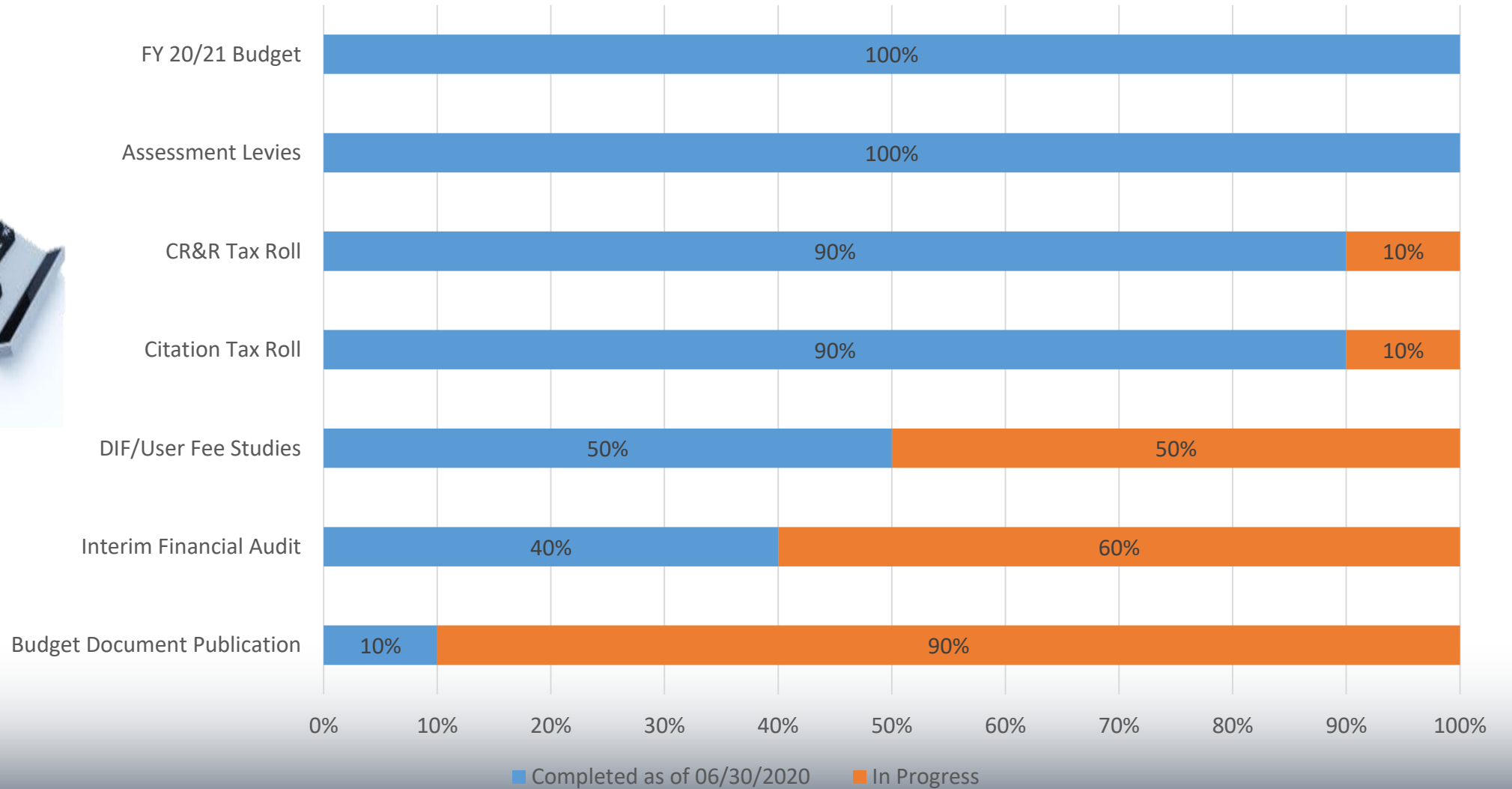

Finance Department Water Billing Overview

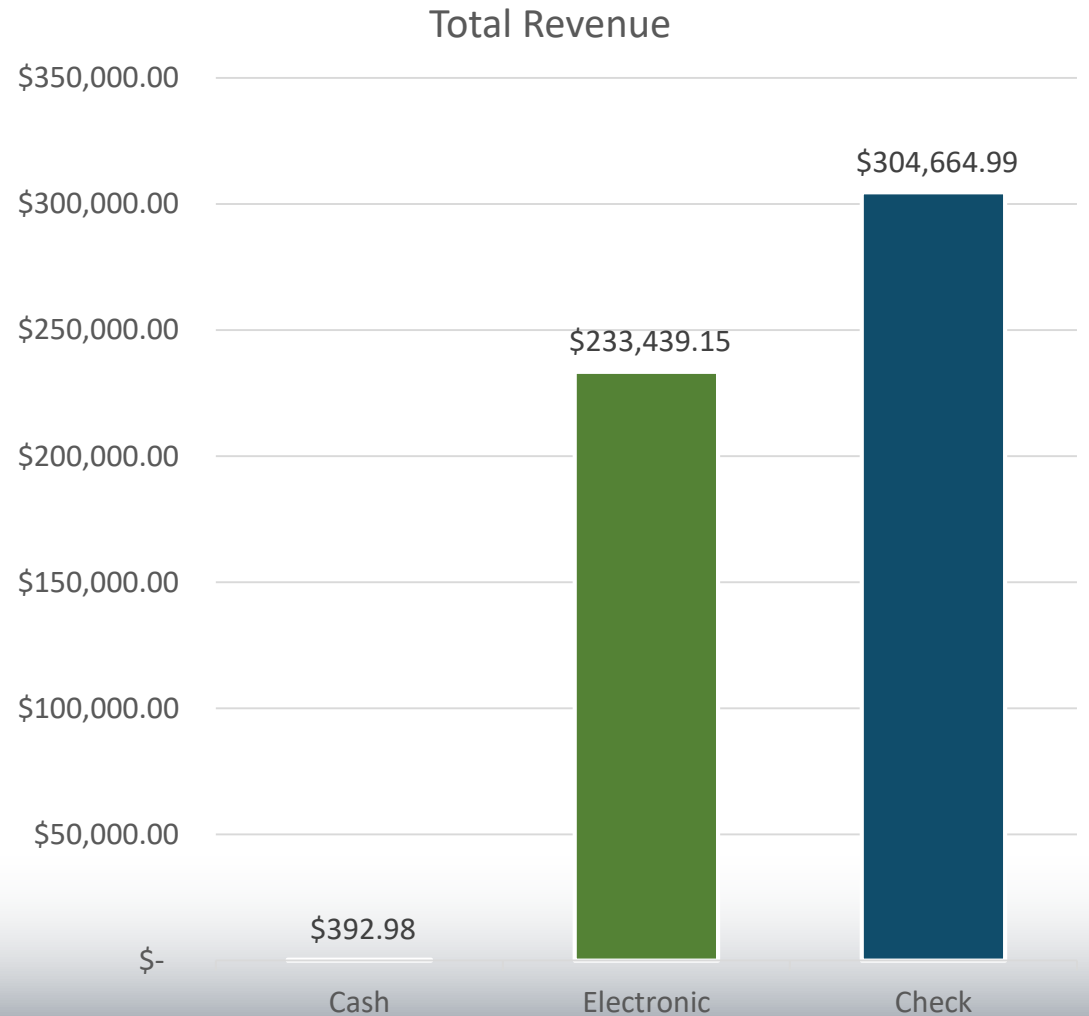
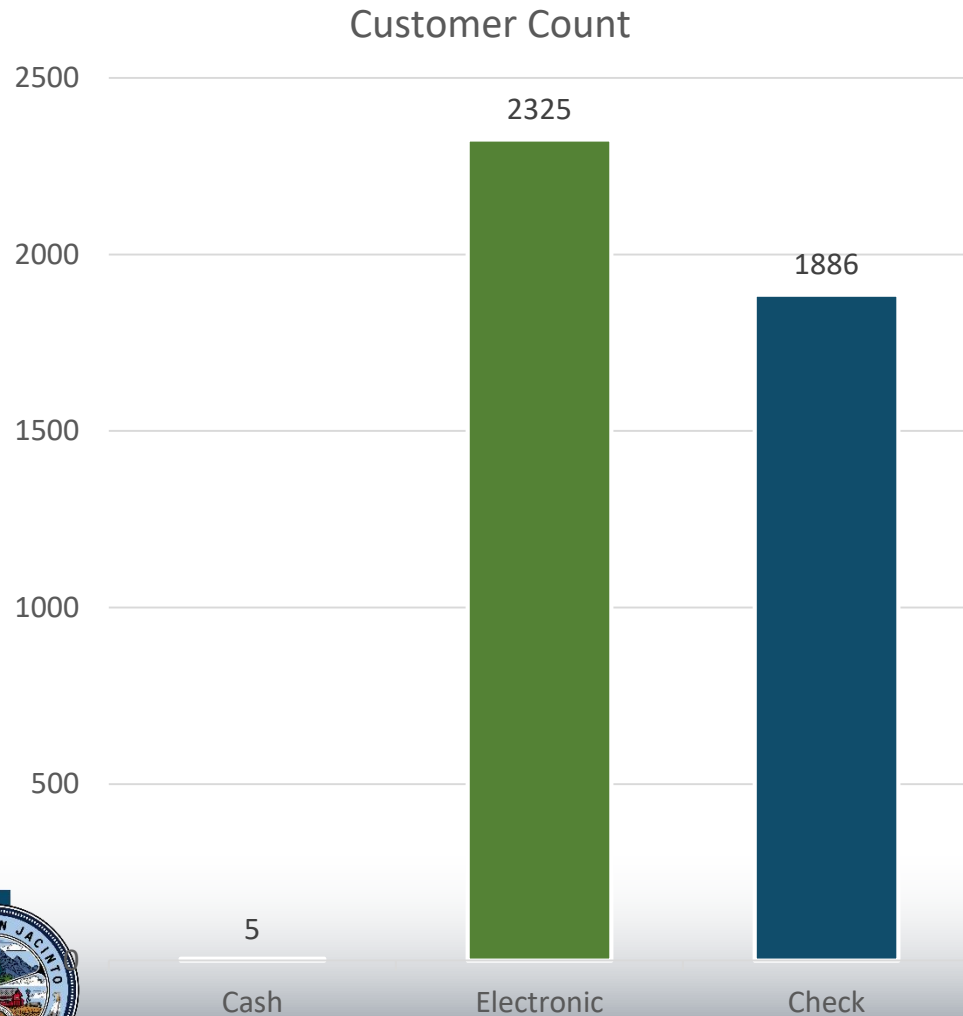

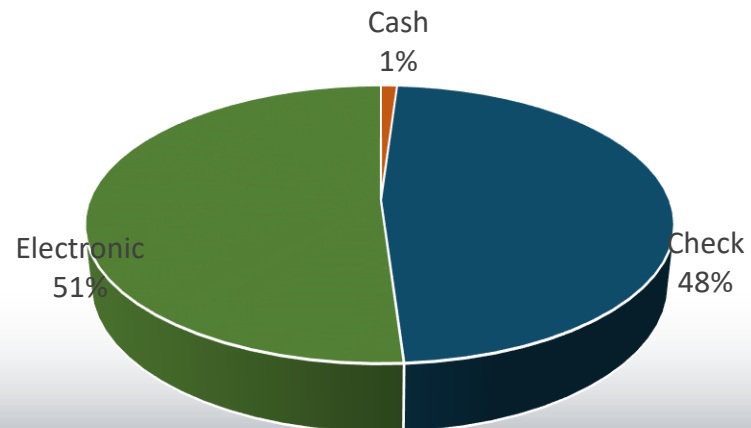
Water Utilities Payment Methods by *Customer Count* and *Total Revenue*

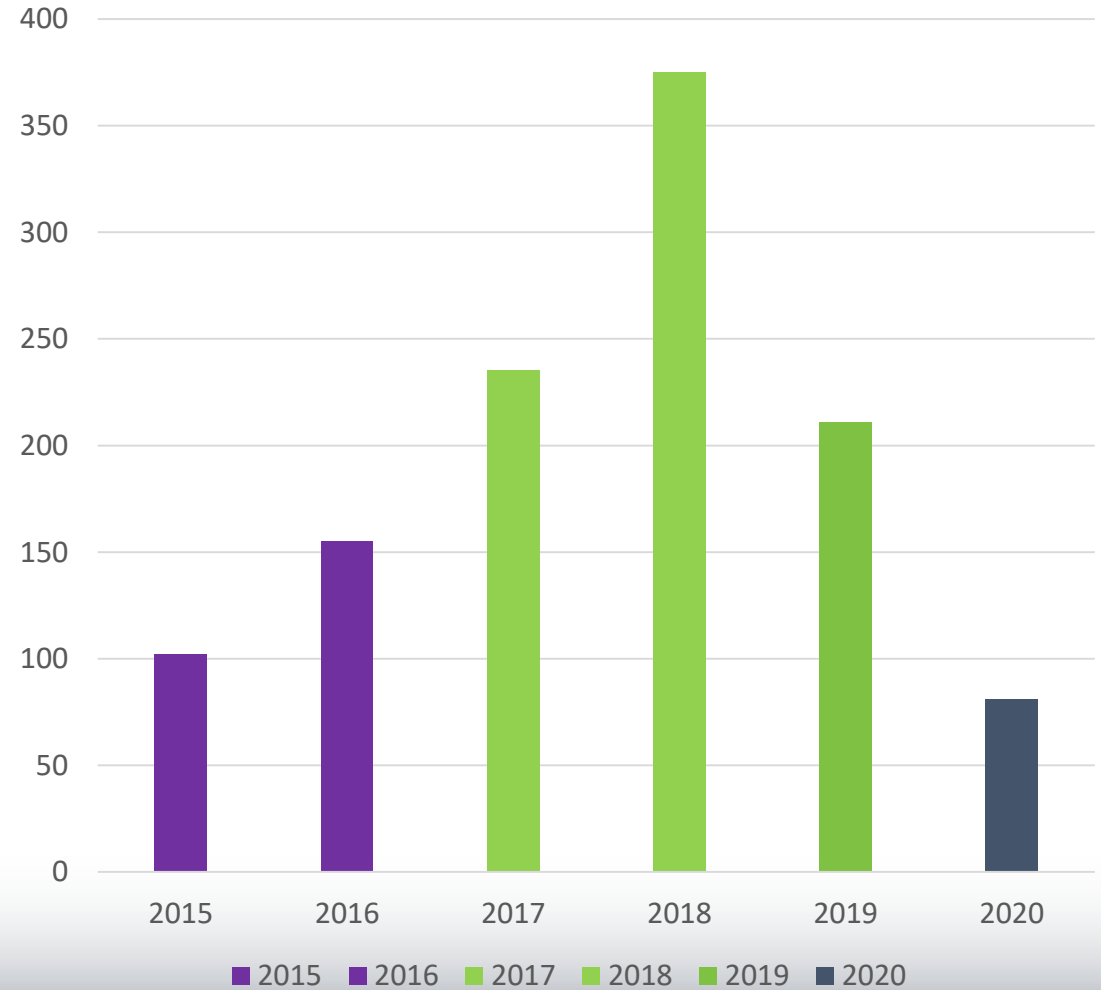

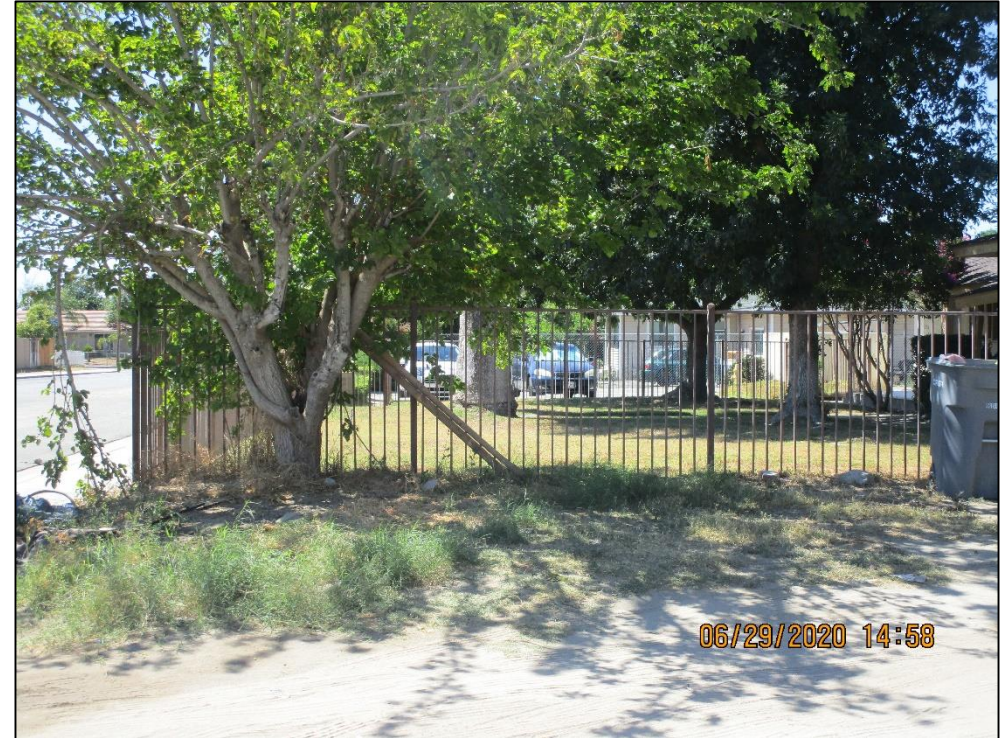

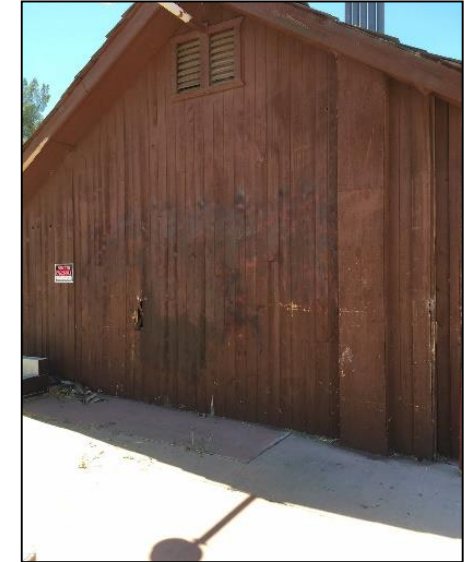

The Riverside County Sheriff’s Department strives to maintain an average response time of less than five minutes for Priority 1 calls for service.

- Priority 1: pose immediate clearly defined threat to human life, property & involve high level of violence with potential for serious injury.
- Priority 1A: pose or did pose immediate threat to human life or property.
- Priority 2: Urgent, but not life threatening. Disturbance with potential for violence & certain thefts.
- Priority 3: Non life threatening, not urgent, disturbance of the peace.
- Priority 4: with exception of several felonies, most past calls are Priority 4.



Election Information

- Last Day for Election Filing, unless an incumbent does not file is Friday, August 7th.
- If an incumbent does not file by that date, the incumbent may not run for election and the timeline for nominations is extended until August 12th.
- Currently, no filing papers have been pulled for the Elected Treasurer position. If the incumbent does not file, the filing date will be extended until August 12th.
 - City's Alternative Revenue Sales Tax Measure is qualified and will be titled "Measure V".

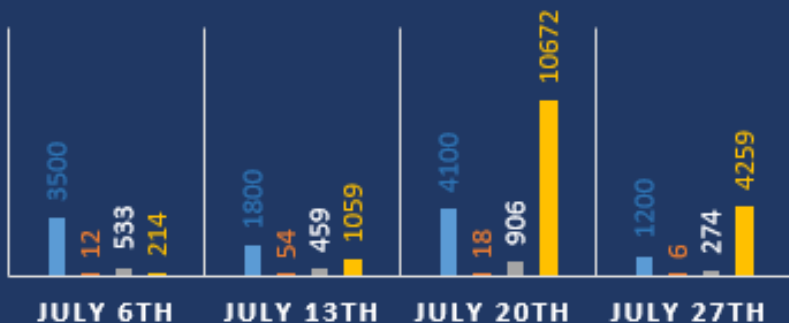

Street Sweeping Enforcement to Resume

In mid-March the San Jacinto City Council suspended street sweeping enforcement as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. As the City begins to gradually open up, enforcement of posted parking restrictions for the City of San Jacinto's Street Sweeping Program will resume August 3, 2020. As of August 3, 2020 citations will be issued to vehicles parked on streets during posted street sweeping times. Residents should review the street sweeping signs posted at the entrance of neighborhoods to determine the street sweeping day to avoid fines. Street sweeping improves the City by removing trash from the neighborhoods and prevents harmful pollutants from affecting downstream watersheds. Cooperation is appreciated.
