Buried utilities can exist just about anywhere on your property hence the importance of checking with DigAlert before digging. You can prevent damage to underground utilities and avoid service interruptions simply by utilizing **DigAlert Direct** or calling 811 two (2) working days NOT including the date of notification (4216.2(b)) prior to starting your excavation. Spring is officially here!! That means all types of vegetation are growing. Code Enforcement reminds property owners of the importance of maintaining the vegetation overgrowth that may be present on properties. This includes residential property, commercial property, or vacant land. Overgrown vegetation can cause detriment to neighbor properties or property values, can become a fire hazard, and even obstruct the necessary view of drivers. MEASURE V IN ACTION

Measure V was passed by San Jacinto voters in November 2020 with 67% approval. Measure V will generate the necessary revenue to increase the City's response to 911 emergency medical, fire, and public safety needs, as well support local businesses (save jobs), attract new business (new jobs), new amenities, and allow the City to remain on a strong financial footing for future years to come. Measure V adds one penny on the dollar to each good and service purchased inside the City limits of San Jacinto. Upon passage, staff worked diligently to kick off essential programming in response to COVID 19 and feedback received from the Community Needs Survey. Measure V will begin collecting the additional cent per dollar spent at San Jacinto businesses on April 1, 2021.

Without Measure Vs approval these quality of life programs and additions would not have been possible.

HARP has performed its own multi-day Census, held a community clean up day, helped with a multi-agency clean up/ removal of debris from the San Jacinto Riverbed, established an outreach plan with San Jacinto Sheriff's Department, and has created a community network of volunteers, community partners, and agency partnerships to help assist the vision. 




NEW FIRE ENGINE & CREW

March 2021, Engine 25 was returned to service in the City of San Jacinto. The restored engine and crew which was out of service in 2014 due to budget constraints, was needed in order to sustain the life saving operations within the City.

Engine 25 helps meet the needs of the community by decreasing response times, and allowing the level of service to meet the standard in Riverside County. The City purchased a new engine for station 25 and is currency operating with a loaner to deliver increased service until the City's new engine is delivered.
