

__et there be light: The Basin Light Pilot Program



Recently the City of San Jacinto initiated the Basin Light Pilot Program. This pilot program's purpose is to get all the lights in the Rancho San Jacinto basin and channel areas in working order. The program is a 3-5 year plan based on funding availability. Currently, there are 10 basins and 3 channels North, Center, and South that have lights that have not worked in over 10 years. Some lights will be repositioned for better light coverage.



The installation at Basin 7 (Villines Ave. and Washington Ave.) is part of the first phase and is now completed. The completed installation has received a lot of positive feedback from the residents in the area. During the second phase of the program, solar LED lighting will be installed. The solar lights only requires 6-7 hours for a full charge and will work 10-12 hours on that full charge.

GRANT APPLICATION FOR STREET OUTREACH

The City of San Jacinto through the HARP the program has applied for funding through the Riverside County's Housing,



Homelessness Prevention & Workforce Solutions (HHPWS) Department Round 2 of the Emergency Solutions Grant- CARES Act Funding (ESG-CV2), with an intent to fund street outreach and bridge housing. Street outreach would be focused on those affected by homelessness, or who are at risk of becoming homeless. The street outreach would be performed by City Net. City Net is a team dedicated to addressing homelessness, in a city or region, through the coordination of community efforts and activities. Since 2014, we have worked together to provide data-driven services that will result in ending street-level homelessness within the communities we serve. We work together to provide services that will result in ending street-level homelessness through the provision of street outreach, case management, housing navigation, bridge-housing, reunifications, community mobilization, and census coordination.
