







- Old Grand Well Abandonment COMPLETED
- Cottonwood Lift Station Rehabilitation COMPLETED
- New Grand Well UNDER CONSTRUCTION
- Bath Well Treatment CONTRACT AWARDED TO CIVILTEC, IN DESIGN
- SCADA Replacement Received one proposal, but was not satisfactory. Staff is pursuing alternate procurement methods to achieve the desired cloud-based system.
- Lead Service Replacement Program- Evaluating program options.
- Tahquitz Street Sewer Main Line Replacement- Preliminary Engineering Completed. Engineer's Estimate \$320,000.

Self Nomination Period ends tomorrow, Wednesday, August 17, 5pm

- Contact City Clerk, Julia Espinoza, 951-487-7330
- You must reside in the City of San Jacinto
- You must be a registered voter in San Jacinto
- You must be 18 years of age at the time of the election
- If you pull papers to run for one of two City Council seats:
 - You will need to collect 20 verified signatures from registered San Jacinto voters
 - You will need to return the paperwork AND have signatures verified by the Registrar of Voters Office
 - OPTIONAL: complete your candidate statement, \$700 County Publishing Fee
 - All of this must be completed before 5pm, Wednesday, August 17
