

- Allows the Housing Element to be compliant with State Housing Law.









ARPA Funding Update

- Old Grand Well Abandonment COMPLETED
- Cottonwood Lift Station Rehabilitation COMPLETED
- New Grand Well Well has been drilled and is in the design process.
- Bath Well Treatment Set to award bid for construction to Pacific Hydrotech at January 16th council meeting.
- SCADA Replacement Working on RFP for replacement of the City's SCADA system.
- Lead Service Replacement Program- Lead service line inventory is nearly completed and are expecting the final list in early 2024.
- Tahquitz Street Sewer Main Line Replacement- Skorpion Backhoe is about 50% complete with the project.
- Grand Well Treatment Plant Bid awarded to Civiltech Engineering to design the Bath Treatment Plant.

- Robert Flores, Principal Planner, has taken a position with MoVal. The City is openly recruiting for a Senior Planner position.
- New Code Officer Davina Baker is starting with the City this week (filling vacancy left by Cheynne Sanderson, who moved to the County).
- New HR Analyst was hired to fill vacancy from Brianna Daudert's transfer to the City Manager's Office and will be starting next week.

- Toured the Vosburg and City Hall with Griffin Structures today to start the Strategic Study for the potential civic center project
- Contractor is finishing up the remodel to the Corporation Yard
- Planning for ICSC Las Vegas RECON in May has begun
- Moving the Independence Day Parade/StreetFest to the Saturday before July 4th
 - Wider variety of contractors to work with, easier for parade participants, moving it from National Holiday
- Continuing to design Boys & Girls Club Clubhouse at Bolander Park
 - As soon as have a firm conceptual design will share with Council
